# New Home Groundbreaking

### Joyful Anticipation

Dark skies and a chilly mist could not dampen the spirits of those gathered at Holy Family Home for Mass and our official groundbreaking for the new Home. It was fitting that our first gathering since the start of COVID would be for this special event.

Archbishop Nelson Perez, on his first visit to the Home, was the celebrant of the Mass. During the homily, he spoke warmly and directly to the Sisters, "You [are] ministers of mercy. And the Lord has blessed you for that, not only as you run these Homes across the country but as you humbly go to parishes and stand at the door and ask the people of God to assist you, as you're doing now to build this new facility, this new chapter in your ministry of mercy." And, he added, "your decision to remain in this community and for this community is really admirable.... It's not an easy road, but God will be with you."

After Mass, everyone headed outside where Robert Juliano, President of Holy Family Home's advisory board, warmly welcomed everyone. Monsignor Francis Beach led us in prayer, quoting Psalm 127, "If the Lord does not build the house, in vain does the builder labor." Len Poncia, Association Jeanne Jugan (AJJ) member, read from 1 Cor: "No one can lay a foundation other than the one that is there, namely Jesus Christ." Monsignor Beach then blessed the ground of the new building.

Mother Provincial Alice Marie Monica recalled the history of the Little Sisters in the City of Brotherly Love, where thanks to the support of the people of Philadelphia and beyond, the Sisters have served for over 150 years, and since 1905, in this exact location.

Mother Alice Marie Monica, Mother Celine Thérèse, Monsignor Beach, Holy Family Home Capital Campaign Executive Committee members Angela and Richard Clark, Robert Juliano and Leonard Poncia then donned hard hats, picked up their shovels and dug in, to much applause!

The event ended with a reception, a wonderful opportunity to meet and re-connect with friends old and new!

We provided some comfort for them in those trying times."
