Mary Lou D. says that "One of the most joyful days in my life was when my granddaughter had a baby girl, making me a great-grandmom. I experience peace in the chapel, praying the rosary, and going to Mass and Holy Hour. Spending time with my three granddaughters also brings me peace. When I listen to someone who wants to talk and when I pray with them, I help bring them joy and peace. Once I found a purse in a store, called the phone number, and the lady was so happy."

Ann B. says that she experienced great joy when each of her children were born. "I'm at peace when my family is all together and we are talking and sharing memories. 

Since October, 2022, we have watched with joy and amazement the construction of our new two-story building, which will house the skilled nursing unit and the convent. Each day there is something new to see.

Our capital campaign efforts are also bearing fruit. The Little Sisters of the Poor have been awarded a \$2.5 million grant this past fall from Redevelopment Assistance Capital Program (RACP) for phase 2 of the reconstruction and rebuilding of Holy Family Home.

We are very thankful for the assistance of our Philadelphia community and elected officials, especially Representatives Jordan Harris and Joanna McClinton. Their impactful support of this project has made

such a difference to our \$45 million project, and we cannot thank them enough.

We are working hard to raise the remaining funds needed to complete our new Home in 2025. Holy Family Home's capital campaign fundraising is overseen by a dedicated Executive Committee of business and community leaders who bring a wealth of cross-industry experience to the project's governance. The Committee is in frequent communication and meets monthly to review the progress of the construction and fundraising efforts.

The Building to Serve in Love Executive Committee members constantly display deep dedication to the future of Holy Family Home. Paul Murtagh, Executive Committee member, and his wife, Theresa, have

selflessly volunteered coundless hours hosting and attending fundraising events in support of the rebuilding of Holy Family Home. We are incredibly grateful to them as they welcome us to share our mission and spread peace and joy to their friends and families.

AJJ Associates

Every six years, the Congregation of the Little Sisters of the Poor hold a General Chapter at the motherhouse in La Tour. The purpose of the Chapter is to elect a new Superior General and make decisions that will guide the Congregation according to its charism and apostolic mission for the next six years.

A General Chapter was held in the fall of 2022. One unprecedented aspect was the invitation to our lay Association Jeanne Jugan Associates to participate in the Chapter. Ten Associates from around the world gathered in France and discussions were held regarding the role of the Associates, the statutes, and areas of collaboration and communication between the Sisters and Associates.

The Association Jeanne Jugan was formed in 1998 to invite Catholic lay men and women to participate in a meaningful way in the spirituality and charism of St. Jeanne Jugan and the Little Sisters' mission to the needy elderly. After participating in a one-year formation, they make their promises in May. Here in Philadelphia we have 36 Associates, who meet on a monthly basis to discuss spiritual topics, attend an annual retreat together, pray for and sit with the dying Residents, run an annual event for the Residents and renew their promises. Many of them participate in the Little Sisters' mission by helping in the Residents' dining room, volunteering to help at the church collections and fundraisers, collecting donated items from parishes, or driving the Sisters around. They also help spread to their families and local communities the Sisters' charism of treating and caring for the elderly with dignity and respect.

In the end, the Associates share the same charism with the Little Sisters with different but complementary vocations. They help the Little Sisters "make the elderly happy, that's all (*St. Jeanne Jugan*)!"

Association Jeanne Jugan (AJJ) Associates organized a Winter Fest party for the Residents in February. It was 20 degrees outside but inside it was toasty warm with much joy, laughter and goodwill.
